

SUMMER 2019 NORTHERN PIKE Regulation Reminder

A new regulation that began in 2018 has a new limit of ten northern per day. However, only two northern can be greater than 26 inches and all northern between 22 and 26 inches must be immediately released. **The DNR will be enforcing this regulation.**

The purpose of the regulation is to reduce the harvest of the larger breeding females and to increase the harvest of smaller northerns to control stunted growth in a lakes population of northerns.
